2018 WTO Wine-Tasting Competition

The WTO Ski Race Organizing Committee would like to express its appreciation to delegations for their participation in the WTO Wine-Tasting Contest which was held at the Salle des Pas Perdus, Centre William Rappard on the evening of Thursday, 15 March 2018. The wine tasting is organized in conjunction with the WTO ski race and enables the organizing committee to offer an excellent supply of fine wines for thirsty skiers after the ski race.

The Wine Contest was an overwhelming success, attracting samples of their finest red, white and/or dessert wines from 26 wine producing countries, including: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, China, Croatia, France, Georgia, Germany, Hungary, Israel, Japan, Liechtenstein, Macedonia, Mexico, Moldova, New Zealand, Peru, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Switzerland, Ukraine and the United States.

There were 22 red wine entries, 22 white wine entries and 7 dessert wine entries. The wines were divided into 7 groups (3 groups of red, 3 groups of white and 1 group of dessert wines) with 6 - 8 wines in each group for a first round of tasting. The top scoring wines from each category advanced to a second round of wine tasting.

All participants attending were invited to participate by completing a score card for one of the 7 groups. Tasters rated the color, aroma and taste of the wine on a 1-5 scale. Then, an average, weighted score for each wine was calculated on-site to determine which two wines from each group of red and white categories (A, B and C) would advance to the final round. The judges for the final round of tasting were participants who attended the wine tasting. Scores for the final round were calculated in the same way.
